
Would like to thank all residents for their support at our events last year which enabled us to donate £120 to The Midlands Air Ambulance.

Parish Environmental Team

The parish Environmental Team carry out the routine work of litter picking, sweeping footpaths, weeding, trimming hedges and generally tidying the area.

In addition, over the last twelve months they have carried out one off projects including:

- Repairing the entrance path from Woodlands Road, Wrockwardine Wood onto the Cockshutt.
- Pruned the hedge at the side of the allotments that runs from Stanmore Drive to Stratford Park Play area this was a major task as the hedge was extremely overgrown and was preventing use of the path.
- Taken down fencing including posts and replaced with new 1.8m high chain link fencing using concrete posts at the former Trench Community Centre playing field.
- Tidied the grass verges on Furnace Lane and Wade Road/Gibbons Road by filling in the grooves made by vehicles parking with top soil and then sowing grass seed this project is ongoing at the time of this newsletter going to print. We would like to urge residents in these areas not to park on the verges to allow this work to be finalised and to prevent the verges being churned up again.

The team have also been helping to maintain the old Wrockwardine Wood Methodist Chapel churchyard and we have received several comments about the improvements they have made to this area.

The Council has agreed to use some of the Environmental Team budget to provide more litter bins at locations including Richmond Avenue/Pickering Road, Woodhouse Crescent and St. Georges Road near to Wrockwardine Wood Way.

This could be for routine works, a one off project that you would like to be considered or any area that you think needs a litter bin. We are sorry but the team are unable to carry out any work on residents' own property.

Recent burglaries in the area have happened during the daytime hours. To help prevent future incidents PCSO Richard Harrison urges residents to be extra vigilant and advises you to follow these tips.

- Use timer switches available from DIY shops to turn on lights, radios and other appliances when you're out.
- Don't tempt thieves wherever possible keep all valuable items away from view of passers-by.
- Don't advertise your absence when you're on holiday, or even when out at work or shopping. Most burglars will only tackle an empty house.
- Get a friend or neighbour to look after your home when you're away, by collecting your post, drawing your curtains at night and generally making the place look lived in. Be prepared to do the same for them.
- Keep windows and doors secure when you are elsewhere in the house. Fit a door chain and screen callers at the door carefully.
- Property mark your valuables, keep a record and photos agree an insurance value and consider a floor safe.
- Don't hide spare keys, leave them with someone you trust burglars know where to look.
- Keep garden tools and ladders locked away in addition anything metal has extra value and attraction to a thief.
- Keep wheelie bins away from flat roof garages and fences to prevent offenders using them to gain access.
- Protect access to the back of your property especially your garage.


