We have received complaints from several residents about the condition of the grounds of Holy Trinity Churchyard. We are currently working closely with Reverend Stafford to improve the upkeep of the grounds. Any work however will be carried out gradually as we do not want have to increase our precept to fund it as this would mean an increase in the council tax.

Our first 'project' has to be to secure the church wall that has degenerated because of the ivy that has been covering it for many years. The ivy has been removed from the church side of the wall and the section of wall that is cracked will be rebuilt around the end of October.

We will report any other work in the churchyard in future newsletters.

In future all Christmas Wreaths will need to be removed by <u>**2nd February.</u>** After this date the PCC is entitled to dispose of them for you.</u>


Wrockwardine Wood & Trench Local History Group

Universal Infant FREE School Meals

From September 2014 all children in Reception, year 1 and year 2 will be eligible for a cooked school lunch at no cost to the parents.

This is a Government initiative called Universal Infant Free School Meals and is aimed at improving academic attainment for infant children and to help families save money.

All children in Reception, year 1 and year 2 will be entitled to a free healthy nutritious cooked lunch which comprises a main course and a pudding.

All schools are encouraging children to have a healthy cooked school lunch and if you are working with a family or know someone with a child in these year groups, please pass on the message and get them to tell the school office that their child wants a free school meal.

Individual Electoral Registration (IER)

Individual Electoral Registration (IER) is being introduced nationally to help tackle electoral fraud and enable online registration, which will make it easier and more convenient for you to ensure you are registered to vote.

Changes to the way you register

At present, one person in every household is responsible for registering all residents at that address during the 'annual canvass'.

From 10 June 2014, each person will need to register to vote individually, providing their national insurance number and date of birth as 'identifying information' which will then be verified before they are added to the register. If you are unable to supply this information, there are alternative forms of official evidence which can be accepted. An online service has been created by the Government to support online applications and to allow checking of applications. You can register to vote online on the GOV.UK website

What will happen if I am already registered?

To make the transition simple, electoral registration officers will match their existing electoral register against the department for work and pensions (DWP) database. Those people who match will be automatically transferred to the electoral register and will not need to do anything else. The people who can't be matched will be invited to apply.

If you don't respond

A Reminder form will be sent to any residents who do not respond. By law, we must also send a second reminder, followed by a personal visit in the autumn to all residents who do not register to vote under the new system so that their details can be included on the Revised Register to be published by 1 December 2014.

If you are a postal or proxy voter you must register under the new IER system or you will automatically lose the right to use this method of absent voting.

State-of-the-art new £28 million Women and Children's Centre to open in Telford

A new £28 million Centre for women and children is on course to open at the end of September. The state-of-the-art Shropshire Women and Children's Centre will open at the Princess Royal Hospital (PRH) in Telford. It will be the main centre providing care for women and children for Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin and mid Wales. The facility will be for:

- Women who need a consultant-led birth
- Children who need to stay overnight
- Gynaecology services where you have to stay overnight

Cathy Smith, Women and Children's Care Group Director and Head of Midwifery at The Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital NHS Trust, said: **"The Shropshire Women and Children's Centre will be an excellent facility for the region. Thousands of women and children over the years will benefit from this centre and we're looking forward to it opening in September."**

Before doors are opened to patients at the end of September, some of our younger patients are now able to use the facilities early. The Children's Ward at PRH, which was located on Ward 14, moved into part of the new Children's Ward (Ward 19) in May 2014. It is the only part of the building which is open, with the rest of the building opening on 29 and 30 September.

Emma Woodward, a Staff Nurse on the Children's Ward at PRH, said: **"There are more spacious rooms** for the patients and their families and better facilities for the staff. We have had some great comments from the parents, who have particularly singled out things like the parents' room and the play room. Everything is much better."
