	The applicant of planning application ref 25/00339/FUL (item 77.24(a)) spoke in support of the
	application and answered members' question about the development, including making the following
	points:
	The bund is used as an acoustic barrier and helps with the wind.
	The shift pattern is 7am until midnight.
	There are three refugee employees living on site Monday to Friday, housed in two caravans and
	employed through Shropshire Council Employment Services. No approvals have been obtained for the
	caravans.

	that he would not be standing in the May elections, that it had been a privilege and pleasure to
	represent the parishioners for around twelve years, and he thanked members for their hospitality,

#### 77.24 | PLANNING APPLICATIONS

a) Planning Applications notified by Shropshire Council – the following was considered:

**Ref**: 25/00339/FUL (validated 14 Feb 2025) (consultation period extended for parish council) **Address**: Park House Farm, Hordley, Ellesmere

**Proposal**: Retrospective application for the installation of extraction plant to existing building, construction of a fire storage lagoon with associated hardstanding, construction of a bund and landscaping.

**RESOLVED** to submit a representation objecting to the application on the following grounds:

- 1. Concern that the application, if approved, means the site is vastly larger than that in the original application (which may not have been granted had it included these aspects), which was deemed by officers to be finally balanced, with concerns in particular at the time towards visual impact and rural setting.
- 2. The considerable size of the lagoon and questions over why the planning team had not identified the operational need for this at the time of the original application.
- 3. Concerns over the visual impact of the bunds (which double the size of the site) in the open countryside and whether they serve any purpose that could not be achieved by adequate tree planting, as well as questions over why if they are necessary, they were not identified as needed by the planning team at the time of the original application.
- 4. General concerns over the running of the site, including operational hours, caravans housing employees and waste being burnt regularly.
