Address: Former indoor arena and premised, <u>Park House Farm</u>, Hordley, Ellesmere SY12 9BL **Proposal:** Change of use of equestrian buildings to waste electrical component transfer and recycling use

Comment: Hordley Parish Council strongly objects to the proposal for the reasons as follows:

A pre-application enquiry (ref: PREAPP/21/00491) , set out proposals for a more intensive re-use similar to what is now being proposed . It was submitted in September 2021. This would have entailed the use of all the farm buildings for light industrial and storage uses and would have extended the associated hardstanding around them. This was concluded by the Local Planning Authority to be unacceptable development due to its scale and would have conflicted with policies CS5 & MD07b.

This new application is now only trying to reverse this decision and therefore must be rejected on the grounds that it is not a suitable location for the size and type of operation for a rural location. Furthermore, there are industrial estates within North Shropshire more suitable for this type of operation at Rednal, Maesbury Road, Wem, St. Martins, and Chirk.

The council is extremely concerned as to the impact of an increase in traffic movements. Contrary to the statement in the Concept Planning Document stating that the road from Lower Hordley to Bagley is in a good condition, this road is in fact a narrow, winding lane in a poor state of repair, with potholes and sunken drain covers. The lanes are already overused by vehicles (workers and goods) going to and from ABP which is located opposite the proposed site. This causes an adverse impact as a result of noise, speeding, cutting up of verges, litter, as well as the damage caused to the roads themselves. This results in significant distress to local residents who regularly express their concerns to the council. Any increase in vehicle movements would only add to these problems and the misery of residents.

The council questions the information put forward in the application regarding proposed vehicle movements. The applicant seeks to compare vehicle movements with those that took place when the site was used for equestrian purposes. However, this in an unfair comparison as such vehicles were horse boxes pulled slowly by cars, rather than HGVs. The vehicle movements at that time also never approached those permitted so the two cannot be valuably compared. The figure given in the application of 60 vehicle movements per week is also questioned, as is the intention that employees will access the site via mini bus. It is the council's understanding that a vehicle carrying light goods such as the proposed electrical equipment would carry more like 10 tonnes rather than the 28 tonnes stated, resulting in many more vehicle movements than that given in the application. It would be impossible for officers to regulate vehicle movements to restrict them to that set out in the application.

The site location in the open countryside renders the development unsustainable and contrary to various planning policies. The application site being in the open countryside is controlled by policy CS5 which only permits development if it enhances and maintains the vitality and character of the countryside. There is concern over noise pollution and whilst the applicant seeks to claim the noise emitted will be quiet, the council notes that it will be constant during working hours five days a week, in contrast to agricultural noise which tends to be intermittent. Whilst the parish council supports local small-scale business, this proposal is not linked in any way to the local agricultural economy, brings no benefit to the rural community and would be much more suitably located on an industrial estate. It does nothing to enhance the character of the surrounding rural area.
